## **Celebrating safety milestone double in Scotland**

Morgan Sindall Construction & Infrastructure has recorded an impressive 2.2 million person hours without a RIDDOR (Reporting of Injuries Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations) incident over the past 18 months in Scotland.

The achievement demonstrates the company's ongoing commitment to the health, safety and wellbeing of its staff and supply chain.

It comes during a period when the company has completed several high profile projects, including the multi-million pound restoration of Ballater Old Royal Station in Aberdeenshire and a number of important education projects for its customers in Scotland.
