New Inverness office strengthens Morgan Sindall's presence in the Highlands

Morgan Sindall has expanded its operations in the North of Scotland with the opening of an Inverness office serving the Highlands. The new premises in North Inverness, will be the expanding company's fourth Scottish office. It follows the opening of an Edinburgh base last year.
