Pupils take to playground at St Nicholas' Primary

Morgan Sindall Construction & Infrastructure has successfully completed the final external works at St Nicholas' Primary School in Bearsden.

It follows the company's handover of the new £10 million 32,000 sq ft school building in August 2018. Built on the old site of St Andrew's Primary on Duntocher Road, it has enabled the co-location of the former school and St Joseph's Primary, in nearby Milngavie.

Since then the old St Andrew's Primary School building has been demolished, the landscaping completed and the 378 pupils who attend St Nicholas' now have access to the impressive new outdoor space.

The external works include a MUGA (multi-use games area) pitch, a playchip area with climbing tree, basketball court, a cycle proficiency area and a brand new trim trail to give pupils space to play, learn and take part in sports.

Morgan Sindall Construction & Infrastructure delivered the final works ahead of schedule after it was appointed to the project by hub West Scotland for long-standing customer, East Dunbartonshire Council.

St Nicholas' is the fifth school to be built through the council's Primary School Improvement Programme (PSIP), which is modernising education provision in the region.
